Dear Sirs,

It disturbs me to hear that there is to be another outlet in our vicinity for the purchase of alcohol. I fervently disagree with this on the following grounds:-

This area is fully serviced by Licensed premises for the general public. There is no requirement for Barclay School to be added to the list. These places are able to cater quite well and are possibly, at the moment, under utilised due to the current economic climate.

- 3, There will be more late night foot traffic along Walkern Road with the inevitable rowdy behaviour causing disturbance. This in turn will stretch our Police service.
- 4, Barclay School could possibly, with the introduction of licensed alcohol, be a magnet for under aged drinkers. They may, unbeknown to Barclay School, be supplied alcohol by eighteen year old upper sixth year students.
