






No More Service

 The Team have been very busy working throughout a pandemic and responding to the challenges that have come with it.



Hosted 26 Adult Offender Protocol Panels

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Funding and Costings

What is Evolve?

EVOLVE

EVOLVE is an eight week programme for domestic abuse perpetrators across Hertfordshire.

This is 1:1 support which explores their triggers, signals, challenges perception and gives them the tools to work towards healthier relationships.

EVELVE runs parallel to the No More Service which means the indual will have the same support worker who understands their situation, in contact with them continuously and advocating for them to all agencies involved.

Once the eight weeks is over, it doesn't mean the support is. The service-user will continue to have ongoing support through the No More Service.

You need to have either written or verbal consent by the client (this has to be on the referral) for us to accept it.



Evolve and SADA sit under the same roof, we are able to give support to both perpetrators and victims at the same time. Safety planning is key to each session.

Service users have continued support alongside NMS and after the 8 week intervention occurs

We discuss and challenge perceptions through trauma informed practise

Service users are given tools and tips after each session to help them remain calm and understand their emotions

Record all sessions as per Respect Accreditation and use these for learning purposes

Work closely with all professionals involved in the case through TACs and professionals meetings



NMS Evolve are helping HCC and Home Office research by identifying funding and support gaps in Hertfordshire for perpetrators, with a particular focus on hearing from client's point of view. We do this by being a client led service and allowing them to feedback to us at the end of each session. This will reduce chance of reoffending in the long term.



NMSY Interventions given

- NMSY is client-led and responsive. Therefore we are constantly evolving and upskilling staff to ensure we can give appropriate interventions. Some include:
 - Anger Management Intervention
 - Challenging Thinking, Behaviours and Attitudes
 - Voluntary Drug / Alcohol Testing
 - Grooming Awareness
 - Healthy Relationships
 - Knife Crime Awareness
 - Parenting Guidance and Boundaries
 - Self Esteem Intervention
 - Explore Future (Employment, Education, CV, Personal Statements, College/University Applications
 - Positive Activities (Use of time) e.g. Sport or Creatively
 - Onward referrals (e.g. safeguarding, mental health, CGL, SADA)



Suicide Prevention Work

- The need for evidence-based, effective suicide prevention has never been greater; the Covid-19 pandemic has impacted the nation's mental health and people with complex needs have been especially affected.
- Partnership Development Officer Madeline Heredia recently achieved a City & Guilds qualification in delivering Suicide First Aid Training, meaning she is now able to train other professionals to 'spot the signs' and provide potentially life-saving interventions with clients and staff. This work forms part of a county-wide suicide prevention strategy, funded in part by the Police and Crime Commissioner's office.
- Training has been delivered to SBC staff, as well as partner agencies such as Herts Police, North Herts District Council and Women's Aid





Reporting of domestic abuse SADAP

Every six weeks we hold a multi agency panel meeting (SADAP). The purpose of this is to report and record low to medium risk cases of domestic abuse. There have been 8 Panels since April 2021 to February 23rd 2022.

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Welwyn & Hatfield and Hertsmere 224 clients heard at panel Stevenage and North Herts 304 clients heard at panel East Herts and Broxbourne 198 clients heard at panel Watford and Three Rivers 88 clients heard at panel St Albans and Decorum 144 clients heard at panel




Total Heard at SADAP 958



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This is an increase of 39.1%






Comparison Statistics

52 Families have used our Safe Space provision since April 2021 to Feb 23rd 2022. Compared to last year we supported 33 families.






Children that have been supported through Safe Space Provision – **65 Children**




