Justice for postmaster

A wrongful conviction was overturned

A former sub-postmaster from Hitchin who was jailed in 2008 after being accused of stealing £50,000 from the Post Office has had his conviction quashed amid a national scandal.

Aibodun Omotoso, who was in charge of Walsworth Road Post Office, was wrongly convicted for theft from his workplace and sentenced to two years and four months in prison at the age of 33

A public inquiry launched

into the scandal on Monday. There were around 700 similar cases of wrongful conviction after the UK Post Office introduced the Fujitsu Horizon computer accounting system in 1999, which caused unexplained discrepancies and losses.

Throughout the case Mr Omotoso maintained his innocence, after initially telling the police he borrowed the money to get treatment for a sick relative in Nigeria, because he was told his truthful account would not be believed and if he accepted liability the matter could be dealt with internally.
