During this financial year we have already seen an increase on the number of voids predicted reducing in year income. Options considered include a nil rise on both premium and standard garages, however if void rates are to continue as predicted this would mean a decrease in the budget of circa £42,000. Although an increase of 3% across the board would see a predicted rise in budget of circa £14,000 this could well be offset by a dramatic increase in the voids rates and consequently increased staff time and costs in managing the voids and is therefore considered to be counterproductive. The rises put forward should keep the the base budget consistent with this years budget assuming that voids continue to rise as they have done in the past 18 months. Any decrease in the voids rates will see us be able to collect more revenue than anticipated but it is prudent to keep budgets levels at the same level as the previous year. The Council agreed the reduction in the overall budget last year in November 2011 (2012/13 budget £437,000). Additionally an increase in the budget was planned for 2013/14 to £497,100 to account for the decrease in the number of voids in the market. The agreement with the Market Traders Association requires the level of fees to be reviewed every three months and no increase for at least 6 months (01/05/12). At the reviews so far it has been agreed that no increase is justified due to the continuing economic situation and also the footfall and trade across the market. It is anticipated therefore that there will now be no increase in charges until April 2014 but in the meantime income will be increased by take up of the void stalls due to the low licence fee and packages on offer.
