Communications for bad weather suspension of service Look at a comparative Council with an in-house service, either locally (e.g. Dacorum)or outside Herts (Harlow/Basildon/Milton Keynes) Impact of Alternate Weekly Collection? How many "neighbour disputes" do we know about concerning rubbish e.g. rubbish put in someone else's bin; rubbish not put out but accumulating and blowing around; rubbish just dumped
