<p><u>Scrutiny Review Title:</u></p>	<p>Tree & Hedge Policy</p>
<p><u>Background issues</u> to review – rationale for scrutinising this issue:</p>	<p>Members raised the issue of reviewing the Council’s tree and hedge procedures, which was agreed by the Select Committee at its meeting on 12 March 2014 as the focus of its scrutiny review. The Council agreed a Policy for Trees which is an inward facing document determining how the Council will manage trees in the town and can be considered by the review.</p> <p>Members wish to investigate this matter as it is a subject that is raised by residents at Members’ surgeries, and is complicated by land ownership tenure, HCC licences to cultivate, and SBC licences to occupy and tree preservation orders.</p>
<p>Is the issue highlighted as one of the Council’s corporate aims and objectives of the Council’s <u>Corporate Strategy</u>, – ‘Sharing the Dividends’? If so which one:</p> <p>Is the issue addressed by the Council’s <u>Community Strategy</u>?</p>	<p>There are no specific references to the Council’s Tree and Hedge Policy within the Council’s Corporate Strategy. However, within the corporate strategy there is a commitment to “Maintain our clean streets and green spaces” and the strategy’s aspiration is to provide “A Quality Environment”, “We aspire for Stevenage to be clean and green, with residents that are active in the local area and with neighbourhoods that are and feel safe. We want a Stevenage that is well designed with a quality built and natural environment and has excellent transport and communication links. <u>If a neighbourhood is well maintained it encourages a strong sense of place, promotes investment and encourages responsible behaviour.</u> We will work with local organisations, partners and residents to promote and maintain Stevenage’s environment.”</p> <p>Regarding the Council’s Community Strategy there is a commitment under promoting healthy communities to encourage residents to “respect their environment and act to protect it”.</p> <p><u>Ensure clean and green spaces</u></p> <p>The Council’s Community Strategy has a commitment to maintaining its green spaces and engaging residents in this process. However, there are no direct references to maintaining tree and hedges, but</p>

	<p>rather there is a more general promotion of the town's natural environment which encompasses trees and hedges, and specifically "We want to increase the involvement of local residents and community groups in actively managing the environment, and will look to create opportunities for people to get involved, such as "Friends of" schemes.</p> <p>Also the strategy states that "SoStevenage is keen to ensure that Stevenage residents have a strong sense of place and are committed to maintaining these spaces as a great legacy for future generations to enjoy and we will ensure that the council's Green Spaces' Strategy and the Biodiversity Action Plan are implemented to achieve this. Well maintained environments, which include the maintenance of hedges, help foster good community relations and social behaviour in neighbourhoods. Scrutinising what undertakings the Council currently provides and where improvements can be made regarding resident involvement in the maintenance of the town's environment would therefore be beneficial.</p>
<p>Is this issue one that raises interest with the public via complaints or Members' surgeries?:</p>	<p>There have been some recorded complaints from the public in connection to the Council's current policy and practise regarding Trees and Hedges. From April 2012 to June 2013 there were 36 recorded complaints regarding trees and hedges. The issues raised in these complaints are predominantly from Council tenants regarding the pruning of trees and hedges and range in their complaint. Some are regarding a lack of consultation and others are complaining about the lack of progress regarding a request that a tree of hedge be cut and still others are complaining about the removal of trees and hedges and the lack of privacy this creates.</p>
