We have lost traders due the economic situation but we have lost a number of traders to shops in Market Place, Park Place and the neighbourhood shops during this period. The Indoor Market has proven to be a good feeder for businesses moving into local shops and that's why the shop void rate in the town is quite low compared to other towns. The MTA in this financial year have requested a further two rent reductions which have been declined especially when a comparison of other local Indoor Markets were carried out and our rents were better than Watford's and comparable to Luton's. Also recently we have stabilised the void rate and have started to get new traders start in the Indoor Market and also some old traders looking to come back into the Indoor Market.
