	The Leader undertook to circulate to Executive Members the report prepared by the Assistant Director (Finance & Estates) which provided useful information on the methodology used for the calculation of the Council Tax Base.
	The Leader asked officers to closely monitor the single person occupancy rate for Council Tax; and requested that the Leader Financial Services Group give further consideration to premiums for 2020/21.
	The Leader referred to some recent misinformation provided to residents regarding the Council's budget. The Leader stated that SBC had reduced its General Fund from £15Million in 2008 to £9Million in 2019. She commented that this had not been wilful act of the Council, but had been necessitated due to a £5Million reduction in Government Grant funding over that perior In addition, the Council had needed to achieve further savings to cover pressures such as inflation and fuel costs over the sa period.
	The Executive noted that the words "Draft General Fund Budget" needed to be inserted at the end of Paragraph 4.1.1 of the report.
