This statement, (consisting of 7 page(s) each signed by me,) is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

- I am a Senior Trading Standards Officer employed by Hertfordshire County Council
 Trading Standards Service. I have been active in this role for approximately 20
 years.
- 2. As such, I am duly authorised under several statutes including the Trade Marks Act 1994 and the Consumer Protection from Unfair Trading Regulations 2008. I am also authorised under the Consumer Rights Act 2015, together with several subordinate pieces of legislation made under this Act, including the Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016 and the Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Regulations 2016.
- Part of my duties include acting on complaints and intelligence received from members of the public, local business and Hertfordshire Constabulary concerning the supply of suspected illicit and counterfeit tobacco.
- Since October 2019, I have been involved with an off-licensed premises called The
 Oval Wines, located at 9 The Oval, Jessop Road, Stevenage SG1 5RA. On

Wednesday 23rd October 2019, at approximately 10.30, I went to The Oval Wines, with my colleagues Joanne HAYES, Mark KEMPSTER, Courtney STRACHAN, Charlotte COUGHLIN (who has since left Hertfordshire Trading Standards) and a tobacco detection dog with her handler.

- 5. I went into the shop and immediately spoke to a young Asian male in his late 20's / early 30's who was behind the counter to the right of the front door and asked who was in charge. He gave the name of the owner as Mr Meryem Velibas but that the Licence Holder was Mr Emrah Demirci but said that they were not in the shop that day.
- 6. While I was speaking to the young man at the shop counter, I was aware that the dog handler had been letting the dog look around in the storeroom at the rear of the shop. During this time, the young man at the shop counter had telephoned the owner of the shop, Mr VELIBAS and he wanted me to speak to him. I spoke to a man who gave his name as Mr Velibas, explaining the purpose of our visit and that we had the statutory power to be able to inspect the shop for illicit tobacco. He sounded very annoyed and said that he would not have given his permission for the dog to come into the shop because it was not hygienic. I informed him that unfortunately, the dog was already on the premises, but was under very close supervision from her handler and my fellow officers. I asked if would be able to come to his shop to meet in person, but he said that he was currently in London.
- 7. A short time later, at approximately 10.55, my colleagues Mark KEMPSTER and Charlotte COUGHLIN brought me a plastic bag with several pouches of Golden Virginia hand-rolling tobacco (HRT), one pouch of Cutters Choice HRT and one packet of Marlboro Gold Cigarettes which the tobacco detection dog had found in

the store room at the back of the shop. These were placed in evidence bags and each sealed with a unique tag number, with the details being recorded in a Premises Searched / Inspected Book.

- 8. It is my belief that Mr Velibas had objected to the use of the tobacco detection dog because he did not want the illicit tobacco to be discovered in his storeroom, not because it was unhygienic.
- 9. Next, a second young Asian man in his 20's arrived and made his way to the front counter where the tobacco products being seized as evidence were laid out. Upon seeing the evidence, I heard the second young Asian man said, "They are all for personal use", to which I replied, "What, all thirty-three of them?" and he returned "Yes all of them." The young Asian man was clearly agitated, and my colleagues Mark Kempster and Joanne Hayes had a brief exchange with him which I did not hear the details of.
- 10. When I had finished writing out my inspection report form, I took the second young Asian man to the front of the shop in front of the counter and asked for his details. He told me that he was Mr Emrah DEMIRCI, Licensee of the premises, so I explained the process to him. I said that I had reason to believe that the tobacco products on the counter were counterfeit and that they breached the tobacco products packaging legislation because they were not in plain packaging. I told him that I was seizing them, so that they could be sent away to the manufacturer to be examined in accordance with the Trade Marks Act 1994. I said that once I knew the outcome, I would invite him and the owner (Meryem Velibas) to attend a formal interview and he could tell me about the tobacco.
- 11. Mr Demirci listened to me throughout, but he was becoming angry and I was

careful to keep him as calm as possible. He kept repeating that it was unfair that Trading Standards was taking away his hand rolling tobacco, because it was for his own use and was not for sale in the shop. He said that he didn't believe that it was fake and that I should return it to him. I reassured him that I believed it to be counterfeit, but that it would be sent away to an expert who would examine it as part of the investigation. I explained to him that the tobacco products he was referring to contravene, the legal packaging requirements anyway, since they were not in plain packaging.

- 12. At that point, my colleagues brought two CCTV units to the front of the shop, so that they could be seized as evidence. Mr Demirci lost his temper and started to shout that we had no right to take his shop's CCTV units. Immediately, he telephoned Mr Velibas on his mobile and asked me to speak to him again.
- 13. I proceeded to speak to the same person I had spoken to earlier that morning and explained that I had the statutory power to seize the CCTV units as evidence. I was on the telephone for some considerable time, during which I could hear Mr Velibas become very heated and told me that I had to leave the premises straight away. He told me that he was recording our telephone call and I said that I welcomed that because it would then be an accurate record of me telling him what my powers are, as well as informing him of his rights.
- 14. While this protracted conversation was taking place, I was aware that there was an altercation taking place between Mr Demirci and my colleagues in relation to the CCTV. I heard Mark Kempster say that he was going to call 999 and request police assistance if Mr Demirci did not our officers to carry out their duties, but I

carried on my conversation with Mr Velibas on the telephone.

- 15. A short time later, four officers from Hertfordshire Constabulary arrived at The Oval Wines, together with Gillian Ackroyd, Licensing Officer for Hertfordshire Constabulary. The officers had a brief discussion with Mr Emirci and I heard one officer explain that the officers from Hertfordshire Trading Standards had the legal power to take the CCTV units as evidence and he was to let them do their duties.
- 16. Details of the CCTV units were noted on my Inspection Report Form and in the Premises Inspected / Searched and we left without further incident.
- 17. After the day's operation had concluded that evening, the tobacco products and the CCTV units seized from The Oval Wines were removed from the office van and deposited in the evidence room at County Hall, Pegs Lane, Hertford.
- 18. They were later sent to the relevant trade mark protection company and a short while later on 07/02/2020, I received confirmation by way of a witness statement from Attest UK Authentication Services on behalf of Imperial Tobacco Limited that the tobacco products were indeed counterfeit.
- 19. I wrote to Mr Meryem Velibas, the owner of Oval Wines and Mr Emrah Demirci, Licensee of the premises (under caution) after receiving confirmation that the tobacco products seized from the premises were counterfeit. My letter contained business advice about not selling counterfeit and non-duty paid tobacco products. I received no response from either Mr Velibas or Mr Demirci, despite requesting acknowledgment of my correspondence.
- 20. It was decided that the Oval Wines would be targeted in the next trading standards operation with the tobacco detection dog, to test compliance with the business advice they had been given. Unfortunately, Covid-19 intervened and this had to

be postponed.

21. On 25/04/2021, after Covid-19 restrictions had been sufficiently lifted to allow

Trading Standards Officers to go about their normal duties, I went back to the Oval

Wines, 9 The Oval, Jessop Road, Stevenage SG1 5RA with colleagues from

Hertfordshire Trading Standards and Hertfordshire Police, including Gillian

ACROYD, Licensing Officer at Stevenage Police Station.

22. At around 14.30, officers went into the premises and my colleague, Sarah

STEVENS, Senior Trading Standards Officer, spoke to the person in charge, who

was Sai KUMAR. Also present was Milen JORDANOV, who claimed to be the

brother-in-law of Emrah DEMIRCI and said that they were covering for the

manager, Yasin COSKANULU. I was not party to that conversation and soon went

outside the shop again, since there seemed to be enough people to deal with the

situation inside the shop already.

23. I did go back into the premises eventually, about five to ten minutes later, to see a

box of suspicious tobacco products being taken out from underneath the front

counter in the shop by the Wagtail dog handler. I could see straight away that the

packaging of the tobacco products did not meet the requirements of the Tobacco

and Related Products Regulations 2016 and the Standardised Packaging of

Tobacco Regulations 2016 because they did not have plain packaging.

24. At that point, I observed my colleague Sarah STEVENS writing down details of all

the tobacco products which were to be seized and these were placed into evidence

bags and sealed with tamper-proof evidence tags.

25. I am also aware that my colleague, Sarah STEVENS found nine packets of

prescription only medication on sale from underneath the counter.

- 26. These were subsequently recorded in the evidence log in accordance with department policies and procedures.
- 27. I can state that following an in-house examination of the tobacco products seized from the shop, 940 cigarettes are believed to be counterfeit/non-duty paid and the amount of hand-rolling tobacco seized is 1.15 kg.
- 28. From experience, I am aware that an illicit packet of cigarettes is sold for between £5.00 and £7.50, so taking the lower value, it is estimated that the street value of the cigarettes seized is approximately £230.00. I am also aware that 50g of handrolling tobacco is sold for between £12.00 and £15.00, so again, taking the lower of those values, the street value of the hand-rolling tobacco is approximately £276.00.
- 29. Officers from Hertfordshire Trading Standards are currently in the process of sending the seized tobacco away for examination by the relevant brand-holders, which will determine ultimately how much of the tobacco is indeed counterfeit / non-duty paid. A full criminal investigation will also follow.

- I am a Senior Trading Standards Officer employed by Hertfordshire County Council Trading Standards Service. I have been active in this role for approximately 20 years.
- 2. As such, I am duly authorised under several statutes including the Trade Marks Act 1994 and the Consumer Protection from Unfair Trading Regulations 2008, together with other pieces of relevant legislation, including the Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016 and the Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Products Regulations 2015. My statutory powers derive from the Consumer Protection Act 2015.
- Part of my duties include acting on complaints and intelligence received from members of the public and other enforcement agencies, including Hertfordshire Police.
- 4. Towards the end of June 2024, Hertfordshire Trading Standards received a complaint via Gillian Akroyd 7779, Senior Licensing Officer, Community Safety Unit, Stevenage Police in relation to Oval Wines, 9 The Oval, Stevenage SG1 5RA and possible illicit tobacco being sold from there. In response to that

complaint, I went to the premises on 2 July 2024, with my colleagues Mark KEMPSTER, Courtney STRACHAN and Sarah KING.

- 5. I entered the premises at approximately 13.20 on 02/07/2024 and saw that there was a young Asian man behind the main counter in the shop. I showed him my credentials and explained that I was there to conduct a tobacco and vapes inspection, but would look at other items in the shop, including the alcohol. I informed him that I had a Notice of Powers and Rights for him to read and sign, which he did. He gave his name as Pamula ANIL and told me that his boss was not present, but his name was Mr Emrah ORUC. I produce a copy of the Notice that I gave to Mr Anil as **EMK/1**.
- 6. During the visit, I was checking items on the shop floor and behind the main counter when Mark KEMPSTER directed my attention towards illicit tobacco products hidden between cans of drink in the storeroom area. Some were branded products which I can state did not comply with the Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016 and the Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Products Regulations 2015. The other items I suspected to be counterfeit in contravention of the Trade Marks Act 1994. I observed that someone had taken time to remove cans of drink from the middle of each palette with the purpose of hiding illegal tobacco there, away from the legitimate tobacco contained in the gantry behind the counter in the main shop.
- 7. There was a mixture of four Amber Leaf 50g pouches, 12 Golden Virginia 50g pouches and also five packets of "KAMAGRA ORAL JELLY". It is my understanding that Kamagra shares the same active ingredient as the drug "Viagra", which is a prescription only medication and cannot legally be sold in an

off-licensed premises.

- 8. These items were seized under the Consumer Rights Act 2015 powers and a receipt for items seized was given to Mr Anil to convey to Mr Oruc the owner of the business. I produce a copy of the receipt referred to as **EMK/2** and can further state that I gave Business Companion guidance leaflets on Tobacco and Vapes, as well as advice on the law relating to Age-restricted Sales, since I noted that there was no statutory tobacco notice on display and that the Refusals Log was not being completed regularly. I left the premises at around 14.20.
- 9. On 3 October 2024, I then took part in a multi-agency operation co-ordinated by Gillian AKROYD. Also present were my colleagues from Hertfordshire Trading Standards, Mark KEMPSTER and Sarah KING, colleagues from Police, Fire Protection and Stevenage Borough Council.
- 10. I entered Oval Wines at around 11.40 am on 03/10/2024 and saw that there were two young Asian males present, one of whom I recognised from my previous visit in July 2024. I showed him my credentials and explained that I needed him to sign a Notice of Powers and Rights which explained the powers Trading Standards Officers have to enter a business premises and carry out an inspection. I explained that we had colleagues with us carrying out different roles, but I would write down anything I found and give him a copy at the end of the visit. The young man gave his name as Pamula ANIL, DOB 19/03/1998 of 34 Wetherby Close, Stevenage and signed my notice, before receiving the top copy. I produce the Officer's Copy as EMK/3.
- 11. Not long after that, Gillian AKROYD handed me a mobile phone and told me that the owner of the shop wanted to speak to me. I took the phone and noted that

that he did not want to make a complaint.

the name on the screen was Emrah ORUC. I introduced myself and explained the purpose of my visit. I clarified that I was speaking to Mr Oruc, the owner and I heard the reply in the affirmative. I spoke to Mr Oruc on the telephone at quite some length, during which time I heard Mr Oruc become more agitated. I recall that he asked me why he was receiving so many visits from the enforcement authorities. I informed him that Trading Standards was required to respond to complaints and intelligence received but that if he wished to make a complaint, then he could contact the Head of Trading Standards accordingly. He later said

- 12. Shortly after that telephone conversation had taken place, I was called into the rear storeroom of the shop by my colleague, Mark KEMPSTER, who showed me a palette of canned drinks on the floor which had several cans missing, replaced by tobacco products to keep them concealed from view, as before in July 2024. There were a total of four palettes like this, each containing hidden tobacco products. I took photographs, printed copies of which I produce as EMK/4 to EMK/7.
- 13. I could see that the concealed tobacco products were a mixture of cigarettes and hand rolling tobacco. There was a total of 19 x 50g pouches of hand-rolling tobacco and 360 cigarettes. Also hidden in the palettes was four boxes of KAMAGRA ORAL JELLY and two extra loose packets.
- 14. Therefore, I seized all the illegal tobacco and Kamagra in accordance with my powers under the Consumer Rights Act 2015 and sealed them in evidence bags using tamper-proof security tags.
- 15. I produce and identify my Inspection Report Form 63111 for Oval Wines, dated

03/10/2024 which was checked and signed by Mr Pamula ANIL, as **EMK/8**. I left a copy as a receipt for everything which was seized and asked that it be passed to Mr Oruc for his information. I left the premises at approximately 13.20.

- 16. The evidence was taken to the Hertfordshire Trading Standards secure evidence store and booked in according to the department policy on Logging and Retention of Evidence.
- 17. The case is now being investigated and appropriate action will be taken in line with the Hertfordshire County Council Enforcement Promise. ലിവ് പ്രവേദ


